



Office for Nuclear Regulation (ONR) Quarterly Site Report for GE Healthcare Ltd, Maynard Centre, Cardiff

Report for period 1 April – 30 June 2014

Foreword

This report is issued as part of ONR's commitment to make information about inspection and regulatory activities relating to the Maynard Centre available to the public. Reports are distributed quarterly to members for the Maynard Centre Local Liaison Committee and are also available on the ONR website (<http://www.onr.org.uk/llic/>).

Site inspectors from ONR usually attend the Maynard Centre Local Liaison Committee meetings and will respond to any questions raised there. Any person wishing to inquire about matters covered by this report should contact ONR.

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1 INSPECTIONS

No ONR inspections were carried out at the Maynard Centre during the quarter.

2 ROUTINE MATTERS

2.1 Inspections

Inspections are undertaken as part of the process for monitoring compliance with:

- the conditions attached by ONR to the nuclear site licence granted under the Nuclear Installations Act 1965 (NIA65) (as amended);
- the Energy Act 2013
- the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 (HSWA74); and
- regulations made under HSWA74, for example the Ionising Radiations Regulations 1999 (IRR99) and the Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999 (MHSWR99).

The inspections entail monitoring licensee's actions on the site in relation to incidents, operations, maintenance, projects, modifications, safety case changes and any other matters that may affect safety. The licensee is required to make and implement adequate arrangements under the conditions attached to the licence in order to ensure legal compliance. Inspections seek to judge both the adequacy of these arrangements and their implementation.

2.2 Other work

On 6 June 2014, GE Healthcare advised ONR that it had reviewed its previous assessment under the Radiation (Emergency Preparedness and Public Information) Regulations 2001 and concluded that there remained no potential for a reasonably foreseeable radiation emergency arising from operations at the Maynard Centre.

3 NON-ROUTINE MATTERS

Licensees are required to have arrangements to respond to non-routine matters and events. ONR inspectors judge the adequacy of the licensee's response, including actions taken to implement any necessary improvements.

ONR held meetings and teleconferences with the licensee on 10 April, 8, 9 & 20 May and 13 June 2014 to discuss the licensee's progress towards preparing its application to delicense and relicense the site. Revised documentation to support the clearance of the CD1 building at the Maynard Centre for delicensing was submitted on 30 May 2014.
